



PRESIDENTS REPORT

Garry Bell Hon. President

A massive thank you to all our dedicated members who yet again volunteered many hours of their own time patrolling Coolangatta Beach, helping out with all of our fundraising activities including the SOS weekend at two major shopping centres in Brisbane and the two rock concerts held beachside of our club. Without people like you we would not be the club we are today.

Coolangatta SLSC can once again proudly boast that there were no lives lost on our beach throughout the 2018/19 patrolling season. Coolangatta Lifesavers put in a massive 6,528 hours patrolling our beach over the summer period.

They completed 25 rescues, performed 72 preventative actions, 23 First Aid Treatments, treated 421 people for Marine Stings and warned 3,364 people about possible dangers that could have easily ended up becoming a rescue.

When you take into account we had 46,481 visitors on our beach these figures are very impressive for the 14 Patrolling groups that we are lucky enough to have.

Total membership was down again this year with 372 overall members; of these there were 80 Nippers, 179 Patrolling members and 59 Associate members.

We will endeavour to promote and build Coolangatta Surf Life Savings Clubs good name again this coming season and hopefully will attract more new members to our club. However, we are in the process of organising a strong membership drive for next season.

Bronzies Day is when we welcome our new Bronzies to the club combined with our Annual Fallen Lifesavers Memorial Day. This very special day was held on the morning of the 5th May and is becoming bigger and bigger every year thanks to Danny Hoyland OAM who so passionately organises the whole event and as usual had many VIP guests attend including, Karen Andrews MLA-Federal Member for MacPherson, Michael Hart-State Member for Burleigh, Gail O'Neill-GCCC Councillor for Div. 14, Cr Paul Taylor, Mark Fife OAM, George Hill, Ken Hunter-President Point Danger Branch Jared Clark PDB, Pat McCue-President South Coast Branch, Shane Roberts President Southport SLSC and Rev. Alan Bartlem our Coolangatta SLSC Chaplain who blessed the wreaths before they were place at sea.

Special guests to present the new Bronze holders with their personalised patrol caps were SAS Vietnam Veteran and Star of Courage recipient Jack Thurgar SC, MBE, OAM, RFD and QPS Bravery medal recipients Senior Constable Cathy Nielsen and Senior Constable Scott Hill.

Directly following on from the formal cap presentations we remembered our own, the Fallen Lifesavers and family members who have passed away this season. Approximately 40 of our members fully dressed in their patrol uniforms along with our Distinguished Guests stood in line at the water's edge and watched on as our IRB's and the Westpac Lifesaver Helicopter placed wreaths at sea. This event once again was broadcast on all local TV channels including channel nine in Sydney and has certainly given Coolangatta SLSC a lot of fantastic positive publicity.

Coolangatta's Chief Training Officer Belinda Doman has again achieved some fantastic results for us with 28 Bronze Medallions, 26 ART, 18 SSV, 32 First Aid, 26 Radio, 30 CPR, 12 Beach Management, 17 Tractor, 8 SRC, 10 IRBC and 4 IRBD awards completed. Thank you, Belinda, for everything you do and for the many hours you put in to make this happen for Coolangatta SLSC. Also thank you to all of our in-house assessors and trainers who assisted with training, assessments and proficiencies throughout the year.

Our Supporters Club is definitely running the best it ever has under the guidance of Manager Steve Edgar and the Supporters Club committee. This year we have been holding joint committee meetings with both the SLSC committee and the Supporters club committee every three months; this has proven to be very successful and will continue to be ongoing.

TREASURER'S REPORT Damian Ling Hon. Treasurer

I am glad to be reporting on such a successful season as we have seen a tremendous improvement from this time last year. The impact of the commonwealth games was undoubtably the biggest challenge that the club has faced for a long time regarding the impact on cash flow and post games we saw a steady rebound.

I would like to thank all those who have assisted this season to make this outcome possible and I would like to thank the committee for placing their understanding and assistance through the first part of the year.

Reviewing our revenue for the year, we saw an increase of total revenue to \$1,121,393 up 52.3% from the previous year. The standout increases were a 34.1% increase in Government Grants, a massive 253.6% increase in Donations and a fantastic increase in income streams that are reliant on SLSC members being involved in face-to-face efforts like BBQ's (up 18.5%), Raffles (up 43.4%) and Fundraising (up 42.4%). This combined with the addition of the Summer Surf Girl (now realised as the Summer Surf Ambassador Program) funds raised of \$22,359 all contributed to the fantastic result for the year.

Again, thanks to all those who have helped at our significant fundraisers throughout the year including Cooly Rocks On, Coolangatta Gold and the Summer Surf Appeal.

This year we saw the introduction of concerts in the Queen Elizabeth Park and the potential for the club to make good income on these events was evident and only possible due to the hard work of the Supporters Club General Manager, the SLSC Executive in negotiating a favourable site layout that resulted in us being able to service patrons to the events.

These major fundraisers will continue to be incredibly valuable to our future.

We saw reduced revenue from merchandise sales owing to limited stock being held and limited options for club members outside of swimmers and historic stock. This was an intentional decision such that we could reset and are now looking at providing a clothing to members both with their membership to increase our already great culture and purchasing options as the season progresses. We should see a sharp increase in this in the incoming financial year.

There was also a reduced revenue in insurance reimbursements which is the supporter's contribution to the club's overall insurance bill. An adjustment payment will be calculated based on the current standing agreements between the SLSC and the supporters club and this will be reflected in the July 2019 P&L and thus reported to the membership with the 2019/2020 audited financials.

We also saw a reduction in Expenses of -3.7% from the previous year to \$851,857 leaving us with a surplus of \$257,536 for the 2018/2019 financial year an improvement of 274.3% from the previous year where we returned a \$147,766 loss.

As a result, we have ended the year with a total cash and cash equivalents of \$112,601, a improvement of 229.8% from the previous period and places us \$39,137 ahead of our position from the 2016/2017 financial year.

The summer surf ambassador program proved to be a great stream of revenue for the club and I thank Nikki and her support committee for their efforts in 2018/2019 and wish Marleigh Dreyer all the best for this coming season effort. All the funds raised by this program come back to the club after the judging week and can then be used to support our activities and operations.

The success of the Supporters Club should be commended and recognised by all. Steve and his staff are committed to providing a great environment for members and visitors and this has

been supported behind the scenes by their committee. I encourage all our members to make best use of their members discounts by presenting their membership card when purchasing food and drink.

We began the season with a reduced income from the supporter's club to ensure the sustainability of both club's operations and gradually saw this increase back up to their full pre commonwealth games commitment. Not only has this occurred in the space of the last 12 months, we have also seen an incredible \$558,000 paid off the long-term loan entered to undertake the renovations.

We ended the financial year with an available redraw in the loan of just over \$300,000 which is a fantastic effort given that at the end of the 2017/2018 financial year we only had an available redraw of around \$16,000 which didn't provide much security in the financial climate we were in. To achieve this the supporters club paid an additional \$260,330.52 in the course of the financial year onto the loan on behalf of the SLSC as additional contributions which is 10 ½ months' worth of advanced payments but more importantly as substantial saving on interest payable in the life of the loan. The most impressive part of this is

those additional funds were distributed between October 2018 and April 2019.

In addition to the required cash and load distributions the supporters club also provided a further \$81,733.67 of in-kind donations covering things like patrol meals, raffle prizes and special function expenses; these are all costs that the club would have otherwise needed to outlay or simply not provide. This value is shown in the Revenue as Supporters Club Distribution in the Profit and Loss section of the attached audited financials.

The total value of member discounts provided to SLSC members at point of sale ended up being a further \$20,004.23 of savings directly to members. This was up 43.8% from the previous financial year and highlights that there are a larger portion of members patronising the supporters club which is a wonderful thing to see.

Again, I thank everyone for their support in our committee and look forward to the exciting future we must look forward to.

DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING REPORTDion Ezzy


Congratulations all on another great season with no lives lost on Coolangatta Beach. This was a great season with Coolangatta SLSC increasing to have 14 patrol groups, with 179 active patrol members completing over 6,528 patrol hours. There was a significant increase in beach visitation with 46,481 people visiting our beach, but this also saw an increase in all areas of our patrolling statistics, we performed 25 rescues, 72 preventative actions and 3364 people were warned about hazards. We performed 23 first aid treatments but this season marks the worst we have seen for blue bottle stings

in some time with 421 people. Thank you to our dedicated Patrol Captains for your support this season and to all our patrolling members who have made my role as Director of Lifesaving easy. Thank you for being proactive in patrolling and ensure that the public remain safe while visiting our beach. Well done to all members who have completed new awards this season to help strengthen our patrols. I hope that you all enjoy a well-earned break and I hope to see all your smiling faces again next season.





CHIEF TRAINING OFFICER REPORT Belinda Doman

The 2018/19 season has been another massive year for training. It is fantastic to see so many members keen to develop their skills with 307 new patrolling awards being completed. So firstly I want to say a big congratulations to all members that have achieved new awards this season and I really hope that this enthusiasm can continue into next season.

We have been really lucky again this season to continue to recruit so many fantastic new members. We scheduled and conducted 5 bronze/ SRC squads this season which included 2 x one week intensive programs and 2 x eight week programs training every Saturday morning as well as a special course for our French Sister Club – Belharra Waterman Club. We trained a total of 31 new Bronzies as well as 8 new SRC's. Many of these new members are already proving to be a real asset to the Coolangatta family.

Our main focus this season was to increase the number of members with other awards to improve patrol strength. One area of focus was IRB awards particularly drivers but due to the need for members to have a marine license before undertaking the driver course and the costs involved in getting this license this has always been an inhibitor. We arranged for another marine license course to be conducted at our club again this season for members and continued to subsidise the course cost to make it more viable for members. This allowed our members to take advantage of this opportunity in doing both the boat license and Jetski licence. This season we conducted 3 IRB courses throughout the season training 11 new crewies and 4 new drivers who will be an asset to our patrolling strength.

This season our members completed 88 Emergency Care awards. We are lucky to be able to conduct these courses in-house at the club so that our members don't have to rely on Branch courses. These emergency care course form part of every Bronze course that we conduct so our members are going onto patrol with these higher qualifications from the onset. This season

we saw 32 members complete or update their First Aid Certificate, 26 complete the Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Certificate and 30 complete a Resuscitation Certificate. We also hosted our own Silver Medallion Beach Management course for the first this season and had 12 members complete this qualification which is fantastic to see. It really does prove that members prefer to do training at their own club with their peers.

The Bronzies day tradition continues to grow and it's great to see the majority of new Bronzies present on this day to receive their personalised cap from Vietnam War Hero SAS soldier and Star of Courage recipient Jack Thurgar SC, MBE, OAM, RFD. Well done Danny Hoyland on organising this special ceremony. The day was hugely successful with a strong attendance from our members as well as excellent media coverage received for the event with news stories on Channel 7 and 9. Bronzies Day and the Fallen Lifesaver ceremony is now a strong tradition at Coolangatta that members are proud to be a part of.

A massive thanks to everyone that has assisted with training, Phillip "Hammo" Hammond was always there when I needed a hand, Alistair "Cookie" McCook has been the most amazing asset to our club this season and brings with him a wealth of knowledge and experience. A massive thanks must go to Cookie for putting your hand up to run the French Bronze group, I know the language barrier was a little daunting but you all seemed to have an amazing week. To Damian Ling and Dion Ezzy your dedication to IRB training is greatly appreciated and it was really fantastic that we could grow the numbers of crewies and drivers during the season which is going to make rostering patrols that bit easier next season. Thanks also to Garry Bell for jumping in and leading a hand whenever your busy schedule allowed it. To our coach Daniel Homer for assisting in teaching board skills to our new Bronze and SRC candidates, thanks for your time and expertise in this area. I'm sure all of our new patrolling members will always remember that "the board is Gold!" To the large number of the members that helped with water safety, swimming with the bronze trainees or keeping an eye

on my girls while I trained squads I can't thank you enough because without your support we certainly couldn't have achieved the great result we have this season. You know who you are because there are far

too many of you to name. It has been a massive team effort so THANK YOU to all involved!

Proficiencies or Skills Maintenance seemed to run well this season running 4 proficiency dates and a catch up one just prior to the end of the year. There was a fairly even spread across the 4 main proficiency dates again this season which certainly makes it easier on our assessors. A big thanks to Garry, Hammo, Dion, Ross Browning and Cookie for their assistance in making this such a smooth and efficient process for our members.

I would like to thank the management committee for their ongoing support, we are a great team and have achieved some fantastic results this season, I have really enjoyed the opportunity to work with all of you and look forward to another great season in 2019-20. To Di in the office thanks for all your assistance with course paperwork, communication with members and keeping a track of members wishing to do courses, I certainly couldn't do this role without your professional support. To Kerrie Barnes and the staff at branch and

Rachael Clark, Tonya Pade and all the SLSQ staff thanks for always being there to answer my many

questions and assisting me in this role. It is great to know I have so much support! Finally, to all members your enthusiasm and dedication to Surf Life Saving and patrolling Coolangatta beach is to be commended, we are a great club and I am proud to be associated with such great people.

So, bring on the 2019/20 where our major focus is going to be on continued recruitment and that will mean lots more training, particularly Bronze squads which we plan to start in August. If you know anyone that would like to do their Bronze make sure you let them know. If you want to do any awards, please make sure you let me know and we can register your interest. Next season I will be keen to get some more trainers signed off so if this is something you are interested in please let me know, I really do need more support in this role and you will find that training and sharing your skills and knowledge with others is one of the most rewarding things that you can do. I'm not going to be CTO forever and would love to start training up some others to take on this role so I can step back a little bit (rest assured I'm not going anywhere though!) 



Bronzies Day & Fallen Lifesavers Memorial Day

On a picture perfect Queensland day, Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club conducted the 6th annual Bronzies day and the honouring of our fallen lifesavers on Sunday 5th May 2019. The red and yellow patrol cap ceremony commenced at 10am with a large contingent of dignitaries and club members dressed in their famous red and yellow uniforms. Federal Member for McPherson Karen Andrews, State Member Jann Stuckey and GCCC Councillor Gail O'Neill were in attendance with SLSQ Hon. President Mark Fife OAM.

We were honoured to have Vietnam War Hero, SAS soldier and Star of Courage recipient Jack Thurgar SC, MBE, OAM, RFD present the Patrol Caps to the new Bronzies.

We also recognised the first Coolangatta SLSC bronze squad with a presentation of bronze medallions and a bronze plaque to be affixed in the clubhouse to commemorate their important contribution to patrolling our beach.

QPS Bravery Award recipients Senior Constables Cath Nielsen and Scotty Hill from Toowoomba Police acknowledged the wonderful unselfish service our members perform on behalf of the community and they spoke about mateship and the courage in the execution of our duty. Cath and Scotty were in a shootout in Gatton on May 29th 2017 when their colleague Senior Constable Brett Forte was fatally wounded.

Welcome to country was presented by Nipper Mai Nuttal, Alistair McCooke 2004 Australian Surf Life Saver of the Year and former Ocean Grove SLSC Club Captain spoke about the recent tragedy of Point Campbell SLSC father and son IRB team, Ross and Andrew Powell, who lost their lives trying to save someone from the rocks in massive seas.

New Bronzie Bridie Edgar presented a speech on what it means to be a volunteer Surf Lifesaver, and Club Chaplain Rev. Alan Bartlem blessed the wreaths.

After the cap presentation, club members marched down to the water's edge, shoulder to shoulder, mate beside mate, proudly dressed in their red and yellow uniforms as they watched the Coolangatta SLSC IRB crews and the Westpac Lifesaver Helicopter lay wreaths at sea in respect to all our fallen lifesavers, followed by a minute's silence.

On Bronzies Day and Fallen Lifesavers Memorial Day 2019, we asked 2004 Australian Surf Lifesaver of the year, & former Ocean Beach SLSC Captain Alistair McCooke to say a few words about the Father and Son Surf Lifesavers who lost their lives trying to save another. His speech says it all, and why we do it:

Patrol Group 14 had its last day of patrol on the day of the Cooly classic. I reprimanded a man who I witnessed cleaning his swim goggles and sunscreen hands on our Red and Yellow Patrol Flags. He was apologetic and feeling worse for his choice of a cleaning cloth.

For under the Red and Yellow flags, cap and patrol uniform lies a deep and proud history of Australian Surf Life Saving. If you have been a Surf Lifesaver for any length of time you have experienced the loss of a fellow Surf Lifesaver. You have worked through the sadness of the loss of a person on your beach. Most importantly you have committed to stand proud and do the best to your abilities to care and save others to make our beaches safer.

To the members who have successfully gained the Surf Lifesaving Australia Bronze Medallion with your commit to Volunteerism and Patrol Duties as 48,000 Australians have, we now proudly accept you into this historical legacy.

Port Campbell SLSC Victoria is located in what could only be described as one of the missed Wonders of the World. It's beautiful Port, The 12 Apostles, London Bridge, massive surf and the 1878 tragic history surrounding the Loch Ard Gorge.

On Easter Sunday 2019 sadly history repeated itself when answering the call of a person in trouble. Two of our brave Australians Surf Lifesavers lost their lives. Father and Son, Ross and Andy Powell paid the ultimate price. Together with survivor Phillip Younis in a twin engine hard hull rescue craft they set out to rescue a person washed out by big seas. This was something they were very well trained for but on this day whilst the person in trouble would later be rescued Ross and Andy Powell would pay the ultimate sacrifice.

Volunteering is an act of heroism, it's an act of heroism on a grand scale. And it matters profoundly. It does more than help people beat the odds; it changes the odds. – Alistair McCooke

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2019

Note 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (QLD). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

(d) Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Cash & Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2019

Note 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(f) Trade and Other receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(g) Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Fundraising, sponsorship, grant and donation income is recognised when the association takes control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

(h) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(i) Goods & Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST is incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

(j) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(k) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2019

Note 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(l) Economic dependence

As at 30 April 2019, current liabilities exceed current assets by \$219,671 (2018: \$270,780 The Association receives donations each year from Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Supporters Club. The Association is dependent on the continuation of these donations in order to maintain operations at the current level. As at reporting date, the Committee is of the opinion that these donations will continue in the foreseeable future.

(m) Estimation uncertainty

Information about estimates and assumptions that have the most significant effect on recognition and measurement of assets, liabilities, income and expenses is provided below. Actual results may be substantially different.

Useful lives of depreciable assets

Management reviews its estimate of the useful lives of depreciable assets at each reporting date, based on the expected utility of the assets.

Inventories

Management estimates the net realisable values of inventories, taking into account the most reliable evidence available at each reporting date.

Opinion

We have audited the financial report of Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc, which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2019, the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income for the year ended, statement of changes in equity, statement of cash flows and notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the statement by members of the committee.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc as at 30 April 2019 and of its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements and the requirements of Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (QLD).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the association in accordance with ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110: Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

Other Matter - Cash Receipts

The association processes cash receipts for membership, donations, raffles, apparel and BBQs. Our audit work addresses the risk of material misstatement of financial reporting with regard to the level of cash transactions and review of internal controls in this regard. Although our audit did not identify any significant reporting issues in this regard, the misappropriation of cash is an inherent risk to the association.

Other Matter - Going Concern

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to note 1(1) to the financial report. The Associations current liabilities exceed its current assets by \$219,671 (2018:\$270,780) as at reporting date. The Association receives donations each year from the Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Supporters Club. The Association is dependent on the continuance of these donations to maintain operations at the current level. As at reporting date, the committee members are of the opinion that these donations will continue for the foreseeable future.

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the association to meet the requirements of Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (QLD)*. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

Responsibilities of the Committee for the Financial Report

The committee is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the financial reporting requirements of Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (QLD) and for such internal control as the committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.
