FAREWELL NYREE DILGER (NEE RUSTICHELLI)

Nyree was born 13 July 1970 at the Mater Mothers Brisbane she was a daughter to Allan and Carol Rustichelli and sister to Brianne. Nyree was a clever child at school who participated in advanced learning programs, she was a talented clarinet player and a Venturer Scout. Nyree loved skiing and camping. She was very talented and good at everything she tried her hand at.

Nyree joined Coolangatta SLSC on 26/01/1990, She originally joined Coolum SLSC where she completed her Bronze Medallion in December 1986 but later transfer to Coolangatta as it was closer to home and choose Coolangatta SLSC because she had fond family memories of time spent at Tweed Heads camping as a child. Nyree loved that her father was a Surf Life Saver at Surfers Paradise and was so proud to have followed in his footsteps. It was through the Surf Club that she met Lloyd Dilger at the annual toad races in 1990. The Surf Club then set the scene for the rest of their lives together. In 1991, Lloyd proposed to Nyree and on 4th September 1993 the couple married at St Cuthberts Tweed Heads followed by the reception at their beloved surf club, Coolangatta.





Nyree was an efficient and dedicated lifesaver, who involved herself in all areas of club life from manning the radios at Gold Coast command between 1989 – 1992 (which was the Surf Life Saving radio call centre based at Miami at the time), to patrolling her beloved Coolangatta beach, she was a dedicated radio instructor and examiner and a fantastic team manager. She was also a great competitor and a talented beach sprinter in the early years. Nyree became secretary in 1990/91 and was awarded Best Committee Member and also completed over 100 patrol hours that season. In 1991/92 she was awarded Best Patrolling Member and in 1992/93 she became our first female Club Captain and then 1992/93 she was elected as the club Radio Officer.

Nyree continued to be a dedicated patrolling member until Teagan was born on 26 August 1996. Despite this Nyree still patrolled at Coolangatta with her newborn baby in tow. It took 3 years before Hayley arrived on 30 August 1999 and even the birth of her second child did not stop her from patrolling and contributing wherever she could to club life. In 1998/99 despite having 2 young kids in tow she still managed to find the time to be on the 40th Anniversary Committee and played an important role in organising the celebrations for this special milestone in the club's history.





When the time came Nyree supported the girls through Nippers and became an age manager in 2014. Teagan and Hayley are now third generation Surf Life Savers following in their Mum's footsteps, something that Nyree was extremely proud of. Nyree was really excited when the girls were chosen to participate in the Westpac helicopter performing mock rescues on Coolangatta beach in December 2016.

Seven years ago, Nyree was diagnosed with an aggressive breast cancer but she never let this stop her, she fought hard and proved the Doctors wrong again and again. Whilst fighting the ultimate fight for her life she was still just as committed to her beloved Coolangatta SLSC as ever. Even whilst undergoing chemotherapy and radiation therapy she continued to serve the club as a Nipper Age Manager, she still assisted with fundraising raffles and BBQ's and attended the annual Brisbane House to House Collection. When the club introduced the Bluebottles programme for kids with special needs Nyree became one of our most reliable volunteers driving down from Brisbane on a Saturday morning to assist with this program. She was a woman with a huge heart, and infectious laugh and a beautiful personality. It was a very sad day when on 13th January 2018 we learnt of the passing of Nyree.





Nyree was a loyal member of Coolangatta SLSC who gave freely of her time to the betterment of the club and Surf Life Saving as a whole. She was truly a dedicated member, Surf Life Saver and volunteer but most importantly she was a friend whom we miss dearly. Coolangatta SLSC is a better place for having had Nyree a part of it and we are lucky to have known you and privileged to call you our friend. Rest In Peace Nyree.



FAREWELL ANDY VAUGHN



It was with great sadness that we farewelled long time Coolangatta SLSC member and dear friend, Andy Vaughan during the past season.

Andy joined the Coolangatta SLSC in 2002 with his son Ryan in the Nippers. In 2004 he completed his Bronze Medallion and spent many hours patrolling Coolangatta Beach during the 2004/05 and 2005/06 seasons.

In 2010 Andy completed his ATV and Tractor Induction courses and this was to become his passion at the Club. He took on

the role of Gear Steward for the Nippers, and he dedicated himself to this role. Andy was always first on the beach in his beloved tractor each Sunday morning, setting up for the Nippers and then last to leave, ensuring every piece of equipment was checked and packed away in its place. Andy continued to support the Nippers in his Gear Steward role, often with his son Ryan in the later years after he graduated from Nippers until ill health took hold and he was no longer able to sit in the tractor.





Andy spent many years volunteering his time to the club in the role of Gear Steward. He brought his exceptional mechanical and handyman skills to his role of Gear Steward, devoting his time to maintaining and repairing equipment. He was often spotted taking a few boards home, carrying out repairs to keep them available for the kids while saving the club many dollars. Andy was also dedicated to helping out with fundraising. He would often jump in when the rostered members were unavailable to cover their upstairs raffle duty, without fuss or seeking acknowledgement. He just did it because he knew it helped the club.

Andy loved a laugh and a drink with his mates. His favourite time was joining the boys upstairs and sharing a drink after a Sunday morning of Nippers. He will be remembered fondly as a dedicated friend to the Nippers and committed club member. He will be sorely missed.







PRESIDENTS REPORT

I would personally like to say thank you to all of our dedicated members who again this season volunteered many hours of their own time patrolling our beach, participating in all forms of fundraising and generally helping out where needed around our Club. It was a difficult period during the Commonwealth games for all of us due to our club parameter being fenced off for nearly 3 months and not allowing access to patrolling or training equipment for most of this time.

Coolangatta SLSC can proudly boast again that there were no lives lost on our beach throughout the 2017/18 patrolling season. Our dedicated Lifesavers put in a massive

6,785 hours patrolling our beach. They completed 5 rescues, 2128 preventative actions, 278 First Aid Treatments and warned 2,128 people about possible dangers that helped to keep our beach safe. When you take into account we had 29,682 visitors on our beach these figures are very impressive

Total membership was slightly down this year with 406 overall members; however we are in the process of organising a strong membership drive for next season. We currently have a total of 13 patrolling groups with an average of 12 members each who looked after our beach this year.

Bronzies Day where we welcome our new Bronzies combined with our Annual Fallen Lifesavers Memorial day on the 6th May again turned out to be a fantastic event. Danny Hoyland once again led the way organising this event that was packed with many special guests that included Karen Andrews MLA-Federal Member for MacPherson, Michael Hart-State Member for Burleigh, Gail O'Neill-GCCC Councillor for Div. 14, Ian Levers-President QLD Police Union, Sen. Constable Cathy Nielsen, Sen. TREASURER'S REPORT

This year we have seen an increase in total income for the year on par with the improvement on our end of year cash at bank at end of financial year from \$38,715.53 in 2017 to \$61,276.91. An overall increase of cash at bank \$22,561.38 and more importantly sitting within managements target of \$28,000 cash reserve. This year we have seen the club focus on a variety of projects and investments in members, including;

- Increased social events at minimal cost to members
- Added fob access to the Office and Board / Ski entry door •
- Upgraded the whole of club security system from analogue to digital •
- Changed security monitoring company to make best use of system upgrades and prepare for the NBN •
- Arranged install of Foxtel to the club premises •
- Invested heavily in SLS awards and training material / equipment •
- Caps / Broad brim hats for all patrolling members •
- Rash shirts for all IRB drivers and crew •
- Changed from Gmail to Office365 which has been well received and provides a range of features that we are in the process of working through to improved efficiencies.
- Insurances being financed through our brokers, ensuring stable and consistent cash flow throughout the • entire season.
- Increased cash reserve has allowed us to purchase a new surf boat •

Outside of this, the club is continuing to develop systems and procedures that complement our current operating standards to provide clear documentation, transparency and point of review to improve long term efficiencies as part of our regular ACNC audit process with SLSQ.

This year, we have seen a large adjustment to the asset register that has seen several items; some dating back to 1987, removed to ensure that the register is a close reflection of the premises and depreciable assets that the club holds.

We saw good results at major fund-raising events which is incredibly important as these funds raised are effectively the cash that the club has available to directly re-invest in members via training, equipment, accommodation and various functions / activities.

- Cooly Gold total profit including hosting fees payable from SLSA was \$12,621.38; \$1,887.52 being • derived directly from the BBQ on both days.
- Surf Appeal only \$4,193 which was an increase on the previous year but we can achieve so much more • this season. We have already secured Bunnings and this season we will be running the BBQ at the Cannon Hill Bunnings for the first time in our collection area. An increase of \$1,218 from last year
- Although after the end of financial year, the 2017 Cooly Rocks On festival also netted the club \$5,236.64. Unfortunately, the weather played its part and we saw a decrease in income of around 50% from last year with takings down from \$15,159 to \$8,424 this year.
- Our BBQ income is down from last year owing to a few BBQ's being missed through many factors • including unfavourable weather. One of the main influences on the overall decrease in income at these BBQ's is the increase in competition from other food vendors within the market area.
- The club has now started to organise BBQ's at Bunnings to look to boost these figures and the last one • held at South Tweed proved successful with a good range of members offering assistance during the day.
- Again, a great result from raffles bringing in over \$50,000

Over the past 12 months, we have seen the total of the renovation loan decrease by \$151,093; which is a great result.

Big thanks to the supporter's club again for their continued support providing a total of \$584,493 of cash and inkind contributions to the operation of the club.

DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING REPORT

This season has been a challenging one for our members. The Commonwealth Games saw significant interruption to our beach patrolling, with all our patrol members dealing well with the changes that were made, including how and where our patrols were done. This shows the strengths of our club members towards change. We currently have 13 patrol groups that are all relatively strong. I would like to express my thanks to all of our

Patrol Captains for taking on a lead role and ensuring that patrols ran smoothly this season and thanks to all patrolling members for their support this year. Also a big thanks to The Star Gold Coast for the donation of a new rescue board this season through the Support our Savers Appeal.

Our Patrolling members completed 6,785 hours patrolling our beach. We completed 5 rescues, 278 First Aid Treatments, 2128 preventative actions, and warned 2,128 people, with 29,682 beach visitors this season. I am pleased to see that the number of rescues performed this season are down to only 5, this is a significant improvement on last season where we performed 33 rescues. This is due to a number of reasons partly due to more favourable surf conditions throughout the season but mostly due to our members being more proactive on patrol to reduce rescues. It has also been noted that patrol attendance has improved with far less no-shows on patrol which is pleasing to see. Well done everyone this is a massive achievement that is to be commended, keep up the great work and I look forward to a great 2018/2019 season.



CHIEF TRAINING OFFICER REPORT

The 2017/18 season has brought with it some challenges, but our members were still keen to develop their skills with 269 new patrolling awards being completed throughout the season. This is down on previous seasons, but the Commonwealth Games certainly affected our operations for 5 months of our season. A big congratulations to all members that have achieved new awards this season and welcome to our new Bronze and SRC members. Our main focus this season was to increase ATV & Tractor Inductions. We were lucky to receive a new tractor from Chesterfield and it is important that as many members as possible know how to operate and care for this equipment to ensure it is looked after and lasts. I must pass on a massive

thanks to Greg Piper for visiting each patrol to ensure that our members were trained to operate this new piece of equipment.

Our member recruitment drive was not as successful as the previous season and I believe this was largely due to out of date information on our website. Thanks to Jan Hobson who has the new website up and running now and is ensuring that the information on there remains relevant and current. We have been really lucky again this season to continue to recruit so many fantastic new members. We scheduled and conducted 4 bronze/ SRC squads this season (2 x one-week intensive programs and 2 x eight-week programs training every Sunday morning) which were all well attended. We trained a total of 25 new Bronzies and 10 new SRC's. Many of these new members are already proving to be a real asset to the Coolangatta family. We only conducted 1 IRB course during the season training 11 new crewies and 2 new drivers, we had planned to conduct another course in the back half of the season but restricted access to the club due to the Commonwealth Games made this impossible. We are looking to conduct another IRB course prior to the start of the 2018/19 season to continue to boost our patrolling strength in the IRB area.

The Bronzies day tradition has continued to grow and it was fantastic to see so many of our new Bronzies present on this day to receive their personalised cap from Senior Constable Cath Nielsen and Senior Constable Scott Hill. Well done Danny Hoyland on organising this special ceremony. The day was hugely successful with a strong attendance from our members as well as excellent media coverage received for the event with new stories on ABC, Channel 7, 9 and 10 and in the Gold Coast Bulletin. Bronzies Day and the Fallen Lifesaver ceremony is now a strong tradition at Coolangatta that members are proud to be a part of.

This season our members completed 90 Emergency Care awards, this high number is largely due to our ability to conduct these courses in-house at the club and therefore we don't have to rely on Branch conducted courses. Our Bronze program also incorporates First Aid and Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Certificate (ART) qualifications into the schedule so the majority of new Bronzies also hold these awards which is certainly helping with patrol rostering whilst giving members the opportunity to complete industry recognised qualifications. This season we saw 30 members complete or update their First Aid Certificate, 27 complete the new ART Certificate and 33 complete a Resuscitation Certificate.

A massive thanks to everyone that has assisted with training, my right-hand man and assistant Phillip 'Hammo' Hammond, you have been amazing as always and there to lend a hand wherever possible. Rick Van Kampen, I certainly could not have conducted 2 x one-week intensive Bronze squads without your assistance! To Damian Ling and Dion Ezzy your dedication to IRB training is greatly appreciated. To Garry Bell and Brad 'Bluey' Hartley for helping out whenever I asked, your support is really valued. Paul Teitzel, Jake Mercer and Sean 'Argo' Smith thanks for all your assistance with the IRB course, we can't run these courses without you guys willingly helping as drivers. To the large number of the members that helped with water safety, swimming with the bronze trainees or keeping an eye on my girls while I trained squads I can't thank you enough because without your support we certainly couldn't have achieved the great result we have this season. You know who you are because there are far too many of you to name. It has been a massive team effort and to all involved THANK YOU!

Proficiencies or Skills Maintenance seemed to run well this season running 4 proficiency dates and a catch up one just prior to the end of the year. There was a fairly even spread across the 4 main proficiency dates this season which certainly makes it easier on our assessors. A big thanks to Garry Bell, Hammo, Dion Ezzy, Ross Browning, Bluey and Kerry Rodgerson for their assistance in making this such a smooth and efficient process for our members.

Congratulations to Margaret Cargnoni, Kyara Smith, Fianna Wilkinson and Jake Wickert for recently completing the skills trainer course, I look forward to mentoring you all and getting some brand-new trainers to help share the load. If anyone else is keen to assist with training I will be more than happy to have your assistance. Congratulations also to Damian Ling who has been a Probationary Assessor in IRB and Bronze Medallion this season and assisted with assessing these squads.

To Di Geddes in the office thanks for all your assistance with course paperwork, communication with members and keeping a track of members wishing to do courses, I certainly couldn't do this role without your professional support. To Kerrie Barnes and the staff at branch and Rachael Clark, Tonya Pade, Courtney Taylor and all the SLSQ staff thanks for always being there to answer my many questions and assisting me in this role. It is great to know I have so much support! 2018 SLSA LIFE MEMBERSHIP – DANIEL P HOYLAND OAM



Daniel Paul Hoyland joined Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club in 1973 and completed his Bronze Medallion on 1st February that year. Danny was made a Life Member of Coolangatta SLSC in 1987, a Life Member of SLSQ in 1992, a Life Member of the Gold Coast Rescue Helicopter service in 1989 and this season Danny was honoured with Life Membership of SLSA. He is the first member of our club to ever receive such a high honour and we couldn't be prouder.

Coolangatta SLSC

He has held the position of Club President on two occasions from 1991- 94 & 2013 – 2015, was Chief Instructor 1975-1976, Club Captain 1977-81, Vice-Captain 1980-81, First Aid Officer 1972-1984, Deputy President 1988-89 and is currently Vice President – Sponsorship & Marketing a role he has held since 2015. He has sat on numerous committee over his 45 years at Coolangatta and has been awarded Best Club Member on four occasions in 1976/77/78/79. In Jan 2016, he completed his observers certificate and became proficient in a number of awards again because he wanted to be able to contribute to the club again as a patrolling member and loves getting down to his beloved Cooly on a Saturday afternoon and patrolling with the 'old boys' patrol when work commitments allow it. In his patrolling career on record he has completed over 700 patrol hours of beach patrols.

In his first term as Club President, Danny organised himself through media contacts a new club bus, and chased many sponsors including Jim Beam, Channel Seven. Danny is still heavily involved in sourcing sponsorships and funding for the club through various revenue streams.

Point Danger Branch

During 1975-1980 Danny held the position of Branch First Aid Officer. He was a Branch Vice President in 1991 – 1993 & 2015-2017 and also sat on the Board of Surf Life Saving.

Surf Life Saving Queensland

He was a representative on the State Board between 2004 – 2010 and also sat on the Honours & Awards Committee. His main involvement at a state level have been through the Helicopter rescue service where he was the Helicopter Officer from 1978 – 2004.

Helicopter Rescue Service

Danny was the first Crewman (with crewman Brian Boulton Coolangatta SLSC) to fly the first Surf Patrol on the Gold Coast in the then Wales HRS. He was an original crew member who served from 1976 to 1998.

He was the Qld Helicopter Officer (Aerial Services Officer) a role that encompassed the helicopter service on both the Sunshine and Gold Coasts. In this role he was actively involved in the recruitment, training, uniforming, public relations/media, crew selection, basic initial training and assisting with the design and testing of equipment.





After the "break up" in 1991, Danny with the assistance of Gary Terrell (Pt Lookout SLSC)

investigated the logistics of setting up another HRS using a Bell Jet Ranger. Danny sourced out the aircraft and pilot on behalf of the CEO Jack Mac Master, recruited the crew, selected the "new" crew, trained them, and got the Service going again on the Gold Coast...with the assistance of Gary Terrell. Danny with the assistance of John O'Hara the original Crew Captain on the Sunshine Coast, had the initial talks with the guarantor of the Sunshine Coast Service Des Scanlan at his home at the Big Cow in 1979. These talks were about the crew, training, uniforming, etc.

Danny's devotion, commitment, dedication and loyalty to the SLSQ and both Helicopter Rescue Services is unsurpassed.... outstanding...he was passionate about the Association and the Service. In 2016/17 being the 40th year of the Helicopter service Danny was named Heli Legend #6 for his commitment to this service.



Fixed Wing Service

Danny was also the original Aerial Services Officer for the FIXED WING PLANE...VIGILANCE ONE-1991-1997. He flew the initial test flights in the aircraft with pilot Tom Ward and Garth Andrews. He assisted in the basic training, and the writing of some sections of the training manual. He holds the SLSQ Fixed Wing crewmember's certificate number one Q1.

Danny was always sourcing equipment for the Service....he wrote and personally presented the proposals to acquire a Pulseoximeter and Syringepump (Rubin Pelerman), M.A.S.T suit (Stefan), and over the years has acquired through his media contacts like the concrete for the floor of the Sunshine Coast Helicopter hangar (\$11,000 worth), handheld radios and

pagers (Link Telecommunications) wood/panels for the hangars, harnesses and safety survival equipment from the Safety Equipment section at the RAAF Base at Amberley, even the helmets serviced at no cost at the Air Force base, brand new television for the Gold Coast hangar.

Over the years, Danny has saved the Association thousands of dollars. He even personally approached and organised and designed the crew uniform in 1997. Danny developed a rapport with the KING GEE company and had the crew uniform specially designed for the crew including caps, tee shirts, sports shirts, socks, shorts and flying suits. It saved the Association at least \$15,000 per year...these uniforms were given to the crew, in Danny's mind, as a form of appreciation and thanks for dedicating their time and effort and "risk." He was always thinking of the crew.

Surf Life Saving Australia

Danny also held the position of National Aerial Services Officer (Australia) 1984-86 and 1990-1991 assisted with the writing and research of the National Training manual, visited Services around Australia (Sydney, Newcastle, Adelaide, Victoria) and completed inspections and proficiencies. Danny also attended the Australian Surf Life Saving Educational Tour and World Congress/Titles in Sydney 1976, Vancouver Canada 1986, Gold Coast 1988 and West Germany Lubeck 1990.



Other Honours

- Order of Australia Medal for services to Surf Life Saving 1992
- Order of St John Medal for services to humanity 1988
- Certificate of Merit International Life Saving Federation August 1999

Danny's commitment and service to the Surf Life Saving movement have been exemplary. He has shown outstanding loyalty at all levels of the organisation. At one stage Danny was effetely doing Club Captain, Branch First Aid Officer, State Helicopter Officer and National Aerial Services Officer all at once.



It is a tradition we copied from the Wallabies Rugby Union team and the Australian Cricket team, placing much significance on the famous Surf Lifesaving cap, and what it means to be a volunteer Surf Life Saver.

This year's special guests were Senior Constable Cath Nielsen and Senior Constable Scotty Hill who risked their lives to save their colleague Senior Constable Brett Forte in a shootout in Gatton in May 2017. Their actions to save a mate required raw courage, determination and bravery above and beyond the call of duty.

We also invited George Doniger Hon. Patron of North Kirra SLSC to talk about the raw courage of his Dad, who 80 years ago this season, swam out from the beach to two of his young lifesaving mates who were being attacked by a shark. When asked decades later why he swam out to risk his life he replied:... " that's what a Lifesaver does, that is their duty."

At the conclusion of the ceremony in the Supporter's Club, about 60 Surf Lifesavers dressed in uniform lined the foreshore mate beside mate, as the club IRB crews and the Westpac Lifesaver Helicopter laid wreaths at sea followed by a minute silence.

This day reminds all volunteer Surf Lifesavers, that when on beach patrol duty, they too may have to risk their lives to save another human being. It's about service to the community and the honour of wearing the world renown Australian Lifesaver's cap.

Here are excerpts from the speeches of Senior Constables Cath Nielsen and Scotty Hill.







SCONST Scotty Hill: "Mateship, it is the people that are prepared to jump in when the going gets tough, it is the comrades that are there to pick you up when you fall, it is the pat on the back, it is the lending of a hand, it is when you look over your shoulder and they are right there alongside you. Mates can be the difference between life and death."

SCONST Cath Nielsen: "The red and yellow cap stands for so much which I hold dear - Australia, trust, responsibility, courage, and to me the most important thing- Mateship. I think above all, I truly value those who you know will have your back and stand beside you when you need it."

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2018

Note 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (QLD)*. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

(d) Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Cash & Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2018

Note 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(f) Trade and Other receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(g) Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Fundraising, grant and donation income is recognised when the association takes control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

(h) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(i) Goods & Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST is incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

(j) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(k) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2018

Note 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(l) Economic dependence

The Association has incurred ongoing operating losses, and as at 30 April 2018, current liabilities exceed current assets by \$270,780 (2017: \$207,058). The Association receives donations each year from Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Supporters Club. The Association is dependent on the continuation of these donations in order to maintain operations at the current level. As at reporting date, the Committee is of the opinion that these donations will continue in the foreseeable future.

(m) Estimation uncertainty

Information about estimates and assumptions that have the most significant effect on recognition and measurement of assets, liabilities, income and expenses is provided below. Actual results may be substantially different.

Useful lives of depreciable assets

Management reviews its estimate of the useful lives of depreciable assets at each reporting date, based on the expected utility of the assets.

Inventories

Management estimates the net realisable values of inventories, taking into account the most reliable evidence available at each reporting date.

Opinion

We have audited the financial report of Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc, which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2018, the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income for the year ended, statement of changes in equity, statement of cash flows and notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the statement by members of the committee.

The Association receives donations each year from the Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Supporters Club. The Association is dependent on the continuance of these donations to maintain operations at the current level. As at reporting date, the committee members are of the opinion that these donations will continue for the foreseeable future.

Emphasis of Matter – Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the association to meet the requirements of Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-forprofits Commission Act 2012 and the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (QLD). As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

Responsibilities of the Committee for the Financial Report

The committee is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the financial reporting requirements of Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (QLD) and for such internal control as the committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

We communicate with the committee regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.
