



A Year in review





Thank you to all our fantastic Coolangatta Surf Lifesavers who volunteered 7,585 hours of their time this season patrolling our beach to keep 48,455 members of the public safe, again we can proudly claim that there were no lives lost at Coolangatta beach during the 2020/21 season.

Our Lifesavers carried out 8 rescues, performed 493 preventative actions and had 105 First Aid Treatments, well done team Cooly.

The 2020/2021 season has been a year like no other due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Thanks to each and every member for your patience and support around the club during these trying times. Some areas of the club needed to be closed off for a period of time, this included the kitchen, the Gym and our bunk rooms. Unfortunately all of our major fundraising events such as Cooly Rocks On, SOS Week and all the concert events held in front of our Club were cancelled, again due to Covid-19. Let's hope things get back to some form of normality this coming season.

Total membership has remained basically the same as last year with 372 overall members, 71 of these being Nippers and 164 being active patrolling members. Plans are well underway to carry out a strong membership drive for the 2021/2022 season with the intention to build up our Nipper numbers, this in turn should flow on and build up our patrolling members.

Bronzies Day is when we welcome our new Bronzies to the club as well as remember our Fallen Lifesavers in a ceremony placing wreaths at sea. This special day organised by Danny Hoyland OAM was held on Sunday morning the 2nd May and was attended by a very impressive list of VIPs including Laura Gerber MP State Member for Currumbin, Gail O'Neall GCCC, Mark Fife OAM SLSQ President, George Hill ESM South Coast Branch President, Scotty Hill BM Queensland Police, Ian Leavers Qld Police Union President, John "Bluey" O'Gorman the creator of Police Remembrance Day, Inspector Bruce Kuhn Coolangatta Police and Alan Bartlem Coolangatta SLSC Chaplain. John "Bluey" O'Gorman spoke passionately about some of his past experiences as a Qld senior police officer as well as the important roles of a Surf Lifesaver. Bluey as he likes to be known and Police Officer Scotty Hill then presented our new Bronzies with their very own patrol caps embroidered with their names and award numbers as well as their Bronze Medallions.

At the conclusion of the formal cap and medallion presentation we remembered our own, the fallen Lifesavers and family members who have passed away this season. Approximately 40 of our members fully dressed in their patrol uniforms along with the Distinguished Guests stood in line at the waters edge in silence and watched on as our IRB and the Westpac Rescue Helicopter placed the wreaths at sea. This event was again broadcast on local TV channels and that has given Coolangatta SLSC a lot of positive publicity.

## Deputy President Report Belinda Doman

Coolangatta SLSC has had a great season in 2020/21 where we have been able to achieve some growth and undertake some planning for the future to ensure that we continue to remain sustainable.

I am proud to say that for the first time in 4 seasons was have recorded a 13% increase in nipper membership and a 31% increase in Associate members. We attracted 111 new members to the club this season and retained 67% of our membership. This is a great achievement despite Covid and the majority of clubs recording a decrease in junior activities membership this season. This is a testament to the hard-working junior activities committee and the positive word of mouth from existing members about the program we offer at Coolangatta. With a number of recruitment initiatives in place for the coming season, we hope to see these numbers continue to grow. We have been working on the clubs' strategic plan for the next 3-5 years. This has included engaging with members and seeking feedback and input on a draft plan. With both the SLSC and the Supporters Club currently reviewing existing plans and setting a direction for the future it is a great time to collaborate. We have therefore been working closely with the supporter's club to ensure that both committees are working towards a common direction.

The committee changed to structure of our meeting during the season so that every other month is spent on the strategic direction of the club where we focus on things like the strategic plan, constitution, by-laws and policy review and development.

We have continued to develop our volunteer recognition program by awarding both a member & youth member of the month to recognise the efforts of our members that go above and beyond. We have also applied for service awards for all eligible members and presented these at the annual dinner and presentation night "The Coolies" and we continue to nominate members for recognition awards for the Point Danger Branch Awards of Excellence.

I would like to thank that committee for their support and dedication to the Club. We have a great team that works collaboratively to ensure that Coolangatta SLSC is a great family friendly club that will remain sustainable into the future.



## Hon. Treasurer's Report Damien Ling

Well, what an interesting 12 months that we have experienced. We have seen the continuation of lock downs, restrictions of movement and other impacts on what we do as a community organisation. But from all the darkness, there is always light at the other end, and I for one am pleased to report that the Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc. has performed solidly during the 2020/2021 season and delivered an operating surplus of \$243,622 up from last season's surplus of \$152,929 this is despite seeing a reduction of total income by \$19,975 from last season to a total income for the 2020/2021 of \$988,668.

Some key factors to this are:

- Government Grants were up by 51% to a total of \$71,337
- Sponsorships were up by 564% to a total of \$30,056
- Donations where also up by 13% to a total of \$134,615
- Continued to collect COVID related employee assistance totalling \$34,900

It is encouraging to see that amid all the disruption to people's lives, memberships and thus membership fees were relatively stable, and I thank members for their support and continued faith in the club and its operations and what we offer as a choice of place to be.

We have also seen a reasonable uptake on the Queensland Government's Fair Play Grants which is fantastic to see, this program allows families to be involved in the nipper program where they otherwise would see the cost of membership as a barrier to involvement. I am proud to say that the club has supported this program by not only accepting the vouchers but covering the difference in cost.We saw a complete write off for Raffles due to the impacts of trading conditions within the supporter's club which was a significant impact to our earnings but was happily offset by increases in other areas. We effectively saw the same impact on the relatively modest BBQ, partly as we decided to include post nipper BBQ as an incentive and benefit to the members participating which was well received by all.

We did see a significant increase in insurance this season of around 52% from last season. This was queried with the brokers who noted that a combination of increased in our combined turnover and global insurance market conditions resulted in a significant increase to our business interruption component of the insurance. We are hoping that this stabilises in this years round of negotiations of the SLS national insurance scheme.Generally, the decrease in merchandise sales is due to holding lower levels of stock and fewer sales in general due to COVID. The club has been working to make merchandise available and are working to minimise the inherent risk to the club of stock on hand v cost and delivery times for members. As everyone can imagine we saw a large drop in fundraising compared to previous years, mostly due to the lack of opportunity and the understanding for a period, that people in general were being quite frugal whilst still understanding the impacts of the COVID related measures.

Supporters club distributions down slightly and there are several reasons for this however because of the strong financial position we had built, the SLSC was able to provide rental relief to the supporter's club allowing them to protect cash flow in uncertain times. We saw reduced payments and then return full rental payments towards the end of the financial year which was a welcomed return to confidence for all parties involved.

## HON. TREASURER'S REPORT CONTINUED

The two club committees have communicated exceptionally well and made sound financial decisions in the interest of all club members including allowing the supporters club to access the draw down facility of the loan to the value of \$120,000 in May/June. This allowed for some refurbishment worksto be undertaken while the club was shut from trade and in preparation for the club re-opening. This amount redrawn from the loan and had since been paid back of the back of exceptional trade and performance of the supporter's club

Again, a huge thanks to the supporter's club who made a total of \$477,682 of cash and in-kind contributions over the past 12 months including contributing fantastic meals to the club for patrols and committee meetings. As noted in the notes accompanying the financial statements, the SLSC is dependant significantly on the distributions from the supporter's club. Thanks to all the supporters committee, Steve Edgar and the staff for their professionalism and willingness to work together as a single unit for the betterment of both entities. I thank GCCC, the Queensland Government (through multiple organisations), Federal Government and other grant funding providers for their generosity and looking favourably at what we do through this period.

Grants included:

• GCBF covering the cost of a new patrol arena and shelving in the clothing storeroom.

• Westfund providing a new defibrillator.

• COVID Safe Active Clubs Kickstart Round 1 providing replacement nipper boards.

· Active Restart Infrastructure Recovery

Fund - Round 1 providing replacement senior boards.

 $\cdot$  GCCC COVID recovery for cleaning equipment including blower and wet vac.

 $\cdot$  QRIDA small business adaption grant covering operational cost during COVID.

· COVID Active Clubs grant covering IT updates allowing further professionalism of our operations.

· QFES Lifes aving development fund covering the cost uniforms and PFD's.

• Beach Safety Equipment Fund covering the cost of new radios and rescue mannequins.

• Energy Australia Grant covering the cost of some upgraded First Aid room furniture.

• Stronger Communities grant covering the cost of replacement paddle boards.

We've more than grabbed our fair share and we have a good process in identifying available grants and applying to reduce the impact of capital replacement within the club. I would also like to acknowledge the fantastic support of GCCC in granting additional donations by way of reductions in rates and services charges that significantly reduce our outgoings year on year. A few years ago, we decided to invest in some tap and go terminals to collect donations, primarily for the surf appeal at the time, however these have been in place within the supporter's club collecting passive donations from patrons and visitors alike to the tune of \$1,869 donated through the donation point terminals for the past financial year.

There are dozens of people I would like to thank for the various roles they play in the collective financial machine so I would like to thank Daniel Hoyland OAM, Steve Edgar and the rest of the Sponsorship team for their incredible efforts in the last 12 months brining in some serious dollars in sponsorship and gifts in kind from suppliers. I want to thank our donors who have donated cash and goods with zero expectation of any fanfare and an especially big thanks to Noel and Sue Holmes who continue to be incredible supporters of the club with a total of \$50,000 donated to the club in the 2020/2021 season.

## HON. TREASURER'S REPORT CONTINUED

Even though we experienced some nervous moments throughout the season, we finished with a strong cash position.

We learnt a lot of valuable lessons from the impact of the Commonwealth Games and since then both clubs have worked hard to ensure that we could better handle unforeseen impacts on trading and subsequent income. Little did we know that COVID was the test and I think it is safe to say we are currently passing the test. COVID still lingers and continues to threaten restriction, limits on trade, closures of state and international borders and we are well prepared to progress forward.

We have been continuing to improve our process in amongst all the other operational demands that club life has on our volunteers and employees and will continue to develop and refine these systems and processes to limit risk to individuals and the association. We have invested technology and have seen great improvements for our POS processes and the transition of memberships to the SLS members portal has been a great move. Cash handling is one of the single biggest risks in clubs and volunteer associations and we have been working to limit the amount of transactions that involve cash to protect our members and staff. Other matters to note from the season is that we have renewed out head lease with GCCC through to 30/06/2031 allowing us to move forward in working closely with GCCC on the future strategic development of the club as an integral part of the Coolangatta community landscape.

I would like to thank both committees for their support through out the year and faith in my decisions and Di for her assistance, the role would not be possible without the assistance from the office. Lastly, I would like to thank my wife and kids for their understanding in the investment in time this role requires. Thanks everyone for a great 2020/2021 season and I look forward to another successful one in 2021/2022.






#### Rescues by Method




**Rescues by Activity** 





Rescues by Age

Not only did we win on points, we took home the team of the day claim, quoted as having 'a camaraderie second to none'. Performance of the day went to Gary Gee, Tony Maguire and Daryl Harding, taking out overall first place in the taplin. Gary took 2 seconds and a third In his individual events while also backing up for pretty much every relay. Again, each competitor raced hard and fast. Elizabeth Rudland represented the club at a multitude of local carnivals including Oceans 38 R1 and R3 at North Kirra and Tugun SLSC. She also represented the club at Summer of Surf Round 1 (BHMP SLSC) and Summer of Surf R3 (Northcliffe SLSC), along with Gary Gee. Semi-finals were achieved, as were quite substantial wipe-outs in some trying surf. Nick Jones and Daryl Harding competed at the QLD Board riding championships in January, coming away with a bronze and a silver for Nick. Daryl placed 4th in the short board event. Congratulation's boys! Elizabeth Rudland also competed at both PDB and QLD Surf Rescue Championships, placing 1st and 1rd respectively in the open women's Champion Lifesaver event. Rumour has it this is the first open medal won for Coolangatta SLSC in 32 years. She also qualified for the Australian titles as a result and took out 7th position. This event runs over multiple days and tests theoretical knowledge, resuscitation skills and physical skills in the surf.

In what may have been the hottest, most humid day of summer this year, our little board and ski team took on the branch championships at North Kirra.

## SURF SPORTS REPORT CONTINUED

Gary Gee took a medal in every individual event in the master's division, as did Elizabeth Rudland who took out all open individual water events. Tony Maguire was the resident ski specialist, playing an integral part in relays. Vincent Loubet showed that putting the work in pays off, with a collection of fine results. Nick Fawaz (Mr. Run Club) took out the 2km before backing up and chasing Gary around the board cans. Phil Wyper, Susie Harker, Brian Smith, Rohan Scaysbrook, Jen Graham and John Stormon should also be congratulated for their efforts. It was a day of hot, hard racing with plenty of amazing results, showing just how hard our competitor's work, leaving the beach with 17 medals. QLD State Championships were held at Tugun SLSC. Friday's and Saturday's masters events resulted in a 12th placing overall. Over the course of the two days, 14 medals were won on the sand and in the water, with 15 competitors representing the club. Some of the most impressive results include Nick Fawaz - 1st in the 50-54 2km Beach Run, Jennifer Graham - 1st 65-69 Surf Race, Gary Gee and Nick Jones – 2nd 35-39 Board Rescue, 170+ Mens relay who took 2nd and both Coolangatta Double Ski Teams who took out 3rd in their respective age group finals. We had two open board and ski competitors - Gary Gee and Elizabeth Rudland competed in the final of the open mixed double ski, coming a very impressive 12th out of 17 teams on the line. It should be noted that they were up against an assortment of Olympians and Australian medallists. Elizabeth also competed in individual events.



The Australian Champions were held on the Sunshine Coast in late April and capped off what felt like a very long season. Once again, our relatively small team did an outstanding job. Nick Fawaz took out the 50-54 2km beach run, Phil Wyper claimed 2nd in the 55-59 flags, William Ryan placed 4th in his 75+ 2Km run, 170yrs Beach Relay placed 4th, Gary Gee took out 6th in his Board final. These are but a few of the many outstanding performances. The standard of competition was high; each competitor did their absolute best and represented the club in some very tough fields. The open competition was contested by Elizabeth Rudland and Gary Gee, who raced in the Open mixed double against yet another very tight field, only just missing the semi-final. Elizabeth then also competed in the board, ski and surf races, narrowly missing the surf race final. With the conclusion of the Australian Titles, came the conclusion of the surf competition season. Behind the scenes, the amount of work that goes into organising training, doing entries, uniforms, maintaining equipment and facilitating competition is astounding. To those who have been involved with ensuring we can compete to the highest standard - Thankyou. Here's to next season.















































## CHIEF TRAINING OFFICER REPORT

"5 minute warning!!" Captain Hammo shouts at 7.55am every Sunday between Mother's Day in May till Father's Day in September at Coolangatta Surf Club. Then it's ... cap and goggles? - check; ..togs? - check; ..wetsuit (optional)? - check; ..flippers (optional)? - check. Am I good to go? ... must be!

"Guns up!!". Hammo's next call at 8.00am on the dot, and up to 40 (and sometimes more) brave souls head off for the Cobia's Sunday morning ocean swim. But not before a sometimes inappropriate, but always funny joke (well....?), from Russ or Hammo. Russ says he gets them from around the world... really? Then we're off for the walking, talking, laughing stroll along the beach to the designated start chosen by Hammo and his very capable deputy Susie, somewhere along this amazing coastline - Cooly, Greenmount, Rainbow, Kirra....Who are the Cobias? The Cooly Cobias (named after the impressive large Gold Coast local kingfish - just ask Jim) celebrate our 10th season of winter ocean swimming this year. The Cobias are a hardy bunch of ocean swimmers, most of them members of the Coolangatta SLSC, but others as well. The Cobias actually do the same thing through the summer - an ocean swim from the Coolangatta SLSC, but winter got the Cobias going. Every Sunday from May till September at 8.00am the Cobias compete for 3-2-1 points based on our estimated times to complete our chosen swim. Each week it is different, and it is not the fastest, but it could be.

Our experienced lifesavers select a safe ocean swim based on the conditions which could be from 1 to 2.5ks, or even a relay event, always with "water safety" travelling with us, and often with help from the renowned Greenmount to Cooly "sweep". Some of the crew use the sweep too well, showing a bit of "ocean nouse" but there is always someone there to show the way. And the newcomers ("tadpoles") soon learn, we love to get them on board. Formed to assist our lifesavers to keep up some winter fitness back 10 years ago the Cobias Ocean Swimming Group is a very popular section of the club, growing all the time - keeping fit, and keeping our ocean skills where they should be. Most of the Cobias are qualified lifesavers who patrol during the summer and any new member is encouraged to get their Bronze Medallion and do the same, but that's not essential. We welcome newcomers and we see new swimmers every week. Soup deloop. During the winter season the Cobia's swims are followed by a mug of soup, made fresh each week by a volunteer from our Cobia's team, and the points score tally, a bit of banter about why "I should've got the points this week", the odd fine and more jokes from Hammo and Russ (heaven forbid), as well as a bit of club history from Jim (just ask him). Another great start to a winter Sunday. Club. The Sunday Cobias bring together members from ALL different sections of the club with a common goal to enjoy a swim. We've got boaties (both male and female), senior competitors, just "seniors" (sorry, "our more mature" members), junior competitors, and regular visitors from other clubs, and beyond. This continues to develop a positive club culture and a weekly reason to participate – a valuable commodity in any club environment. Hammo, Susie, Smoky, Snorkel, Jim, Sash, Evie, Russ, Greg, Barnacle Bill, Kylie, Jess, Jen, Sam, Caroline, Chez, a couple of Yvonnes, James, Gil, Brian, Jim, Stormo, Mark, Steve and a bunch from Kurrawa, a bunch of "tadpoles" (our first, second and "getting there" timers) and many, many more each week - all contributing to a fit and social camaraderie building a strong club spirit.

## Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 30 April 2021

#### 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (QLD)* (as amended by the Associations Incorporation and Other Legislation Amendment Act (QLD) 2020). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### (a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

#### (b) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all Property, plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

#### (c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

#### (d) Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

#### (e) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts.

#### (f) Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

#### 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

#### (g) Revenue and other income

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Fundraising, sponsorship, and donation income is recognised when the association takes control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

Grants with conditions attached which must be satisifed before the contributions will be received will be recognised as revenue only when those conditions have been satisfied. Until these conditions have been met the subsidy will be reflected as Unspent grants.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

#### (h) Leases

Leases of Property, plant and equipment, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

#### (i) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

#### (j) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

#### (k) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

#### (I) Economic dependence

As at 30 April 2021, current liabilities exceed current assets by \$71,600 (2020: \$202,453). The Association receives donations each year from Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Supporters Club. The Association is dependent on the continuation of these donations in order to maintain operations at the current level. As at reporting date, the Committee is of the opinion that these donations will continue in the foreseeable future.

#### (m) Estimation uncertainty

Information about estimates and assumptions that have the most significant effect on recognition and measurement of assets, liabilities, income and expenses is provided below. Actual results may be substantially different.

#### Useful lives of depreciable assets

Management reviews its estimate of the useful lives of depreciable assets at each reporting date, based on the expected utility of the assets.

#### Inventories

Management estimates the net realisable values of inventories, taking into account the most reliable evidence available at each reporting date.
