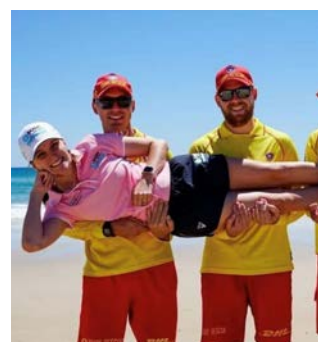

President

With another season finished I would like to personally thank all of our dedicated Coolangatta Surf Lifesavers for achieving our ultimate goal of once again no preventable loss of life on our beach during the 2021/2022 season. Our members volunteered a massive 7,293 hours looking after 35,781 visitors on Coolangatta beach. During the season our members carried out 5 rescues that included 3 board rescues, 1 tube rescue, 1 rescue with no equipment and a rescue that could have ended up badly when two of our most experienced Lifesavers were called to action. A group of swimmers were being swept north in a rip beyond the break and Dion Ezzy and Steve Ward launched our IRB, risking their own lives to assist in rescuing these swimmers in what could only be described as a very large swell. We also had 580 preventative actions, 95 Minor First Aid treatments and 11 Major First Aid treatments as well as advising 820 swimmers to swim between the flags. All this could not be possible without having 153 dedicated Coolangatta Surf Lifesavers divided into 13 patrol groups protecting our beach.

Once again the Covid -19 pandemic caused problems for NSW residents being locked out by Qld/NSW border closures. This created a problem for our Nipper numbers because approximately half of our 59 Nippers who live in NSW could not attend Sunday mornings at Coolangatta SLSC. Let's hope everything gets back to some form of normality this coming season. Overall our total membership numbers are similar to the past two years at 316 members. We will be running a strong membership drive again for this coming 2022/2023 season

with the intention to build up our total membership numbers. Again I would like to thank all of our members for their patience and support during these trying times.

The now well-known Bronzies Day and Fallen Lifesavers Day was held on Sunday morning the 1 st of May and as usual turned out to be a fantastic day for Coolangatta SLSC. Big thanks to Danny Hoyland and all those who helped make it happen. This event was attended by a very impressive list of VIPs that included Karen Andrews, Federal Minister for Home Affairs, Laura Gerber MP State Member for Currumbin, Gail O'Neill Gold Coast City Councillor and Mark Ryan Minister for Police, Emergency Services and Corrective Services plus many other distinguished guests as well as a large number of our own Coolangatta SLSC members. Mark Ryan spoke passionately about Surf Lifesaving during his presentation of personalised patrol caps and bronze medallions to our new Bronzies, this was very well received by our new members. Following on from the formal cap and medallion presentations we remembered our own, the fallen Lifesavers and Family members who had passed away this season. Coolangatta SLSC was well represented by around 50 of our members all dressed in their full patrol uniform along with our distinguished guests who then marched onto the beach to stand in line at the water's edge for a minutes silence. We all watched on as our IRB and Westpac Rescue Helicopter placed the wreaths at sea. This event was broadcast on several local TV channels and generates invaluable positive publicity.

This season our club was very fortunate to be able to have a Surf Woman of The Year to represent Coolangatta SLSC, this young lady was Zoe Day. Zoe and her fantastic team of helpers managed to raise a massive \$56,689 for our club, Zoe also won the Surf Woman of The Year Innovation award. Well done Zoe you make us proud to have you as a member.

Our Annual Awards and Presentation night was held on the 2 nd June this year and again all those in attendance had a great night. Danny Hoyland as always did a great job as MC plus a special thanks to Naomi Currie, Annette Alexander, Christine Marshall and Janeen Nowlan for putting it all together. Good to see our members being rewarded for their efforts. Champion Rower- Agro Best Competitor- Liz Rudland Best Patrol Captain - Steve Ward Best New Member - Lynette Kirkwood Lifesaver of the Year - Karen Ward Committee Member of the Year - Damian Ling Cadet Member/s of the Year - Tayla Rees and Alastair McConnell Junior Lifesaver of the Year - Bridie Edgar Harry Potter Medal - Craig Maidment Harry Connelly Medal - Garry Bell Gorge Best Senior Medal - Gary Gee Noel Holmes Medal - Phil Hammond Best Club Member - Tracy Maidment.

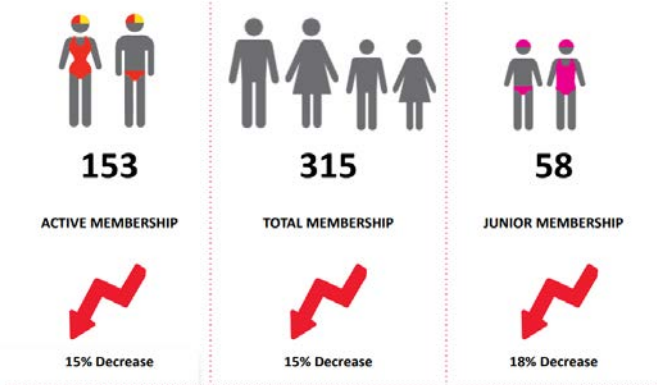

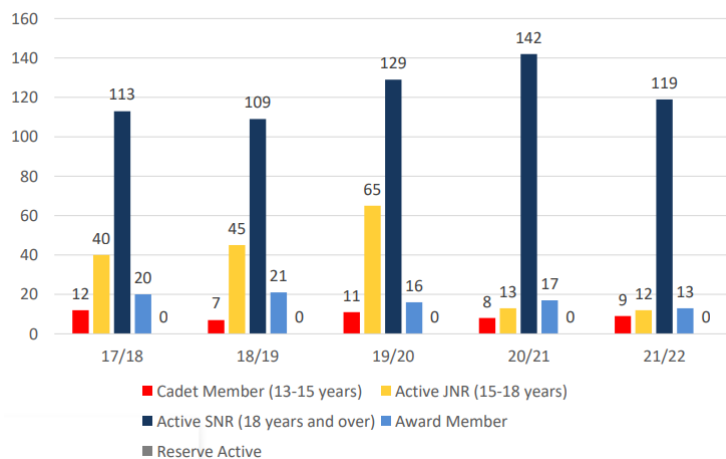
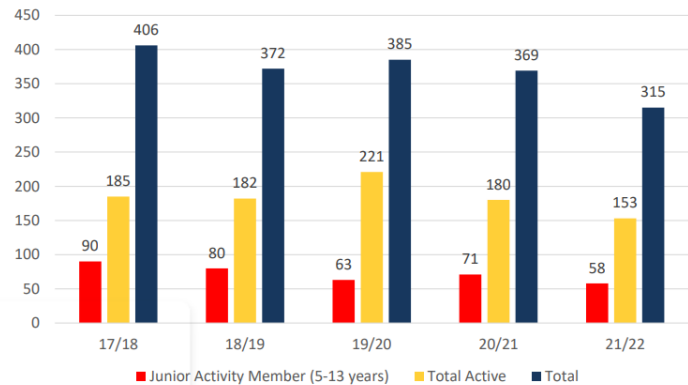
MEMBERSHIP STATISTICS REPORT EOS 2021/22

During the season we also updated our Club constitution to bring us in line with recent changes to the association's incorporations act and will be working through the by-laws to make any necessary changes.

Our membership has unfortunately decreased during the 2021/22 season as we faced a number of Covid related challenges such as border closures and a vaccine mandate announced (which was later overturned). Our total membership is 316 members with 159 patrolling members and 59 Nippers. Our Nipper membership was the most effected by the border closure leading to the establishment of the Point Danger Branch Border Zone Nippers.

This program was held at Fingal Rovers SLSC commencing on 24th October (once NSW was able to return to community sport) and ran through until 12th December, so that our NSW resident nippers could still participate in a nipper program. This was a huge success and it was great to collaborate with neighbouring clubs and combine resources so these kids didn't miss an entire season. A massive thanks to Nigel (Shrek) and Leanne Ward for taking the lead with this initiative and coordinating these activities. It was certainly great to see the border reopen at Christmas time which allowed our nippers to all come together for the first time in January 2022.

At the conclusion of the Nipper season we conducted a Nipper satisfaction survey and the results were overwhelmingly positive. Our nipper families love the program that we offer and this is all thanks to Tracy's leadership, dedication and commitment to our Nipper program. We have a great team that help to run our nippers, with most of the members in key roles no longer have kids in nippers. Lots of our members turn up each week to help with this program and do so much in the background do so because they love it! If you haven't been involved with our Nipper program I would encourage you to come down and help out, it really is very rewarding!

The Coolies was a great night with a record turn out and it was so wonderful to be able to recognise our members for all that they do. Thank to Danny and the team for organising another great event. A special mention to Damian Ling who received his 25 Year National Long Service pin and to Michael Taylor who was the 2021 winner of the Point Danger Branch Andy Frizzell OAM OBE

Award for outstanding service and commitment to Junior Activities. We have a dedicated membership and a wonderful club culture at Cooly and I would encourage all members to share Cooly with a friend and encourage a new member to come and join our wonderful club.

Finally, I would like to thank the committee for all that you do (often behind the scenes and unnoticed) to keep our great club running. Thanks also to Di Lewis for her many years of assistance as our Admin, we really appreciate your commitment and dedication to our club. Whilst you will be missed in the office, we would like to wish you all the best in your next endeavours and look forward to still seeing you around the club as a member.

We have seen another year where the club has produced solid financial results on behalf of the members and once again it is due to the efforts of many and the support of the committee that I am able to present these showing the strength of the position we are currently in. The operating boards of both clubs have worked hard to continue to support respective core operations and each other and regular combined board meetings have driven deeper collaboration than we have ever seen and are continuing to set and refine the framework for our continued success going forward in years to come.

This year I'll look to just comment on the main points of interest in the audited financials and then cover off on some broader comments from my perspective, keeping my report nice and short for once!

Our operating surplus increased by a little more than \$300k on last years' figures which is made up of additional donations from the Supporters Club due to continued favourable trading conditions and an overall reduction in expenses. This has resulted in the non-current liabilities being significantly reduced in line with our strategy to reduce the building loan and for those with a keen eye will notice the balance of the non-current portion of the loan is getting very close to the current portion or amount payable over the course of a year. Elsewhere on the Balance Sheet the club is in a strong cash position and through advice of our bookkeepers and auditor, have recognised our right of use over the land with GCCC upon renewal of the head lease this year and have also recognised long term sponsorship payments over the duration of the agreement as revenue in advance per

As we've seen in previous years, we've seen tremendous support from the supporters club financially and in kind, we've seen incredible government support by way of standing and ad-hoc grants and funding programs from all levels from local through to state and federal support and we have also seen incredible donations as well as strong sponsorship for which I thank every one of those donors and supporters on behalf of every member of our club as we could simply not achieve what we do without their strong and continued support and those thanks also extend to our members who put in the effort at fundraisers from raffles to Cooly Rocks and the incredible efforts of our Surf Woman, Zoe, and her team.

Our focus will now gradually shift from what we have achieved in the past few years to framing and setting what we can achieve in the coming years ahead. Planning in this will be done in a measured and structured way to ensure that we continue to improve upon and learn from what we have done in the past, ultimately building towards a goal of having a modern, sustainable, family friendly club with a diversity of assets and income streams to support our core business goals on behalf of all our members as your elected custodians.

I would like to sincerely thank all the volunteer Surf Lifesavers for upholding those traditions, because without your service, many people would die. What we do matters to the community and we do an excellent job. When you walk down the beach in the red and yellow you are putting your life on the line.

A REAL RESCUE: That very fact occurred on the last patrol of the season on Monday 2nd May, 2022 at about 2:30pm in a messy 2 metre sea. Steve Ward and Captain Dion Ezzy rescued 4 victims using the rescue tubes. Things got real serious when a mass rescue had to be performed, so Steve Ward and Dion Ezzy launched the IRB. On the beach Patrol Captain Geoff Hamlet, Rod Tyler, Karen Ward and Leanne Matthews were co-ordinating the rescue and called in the support of the SLSQ wave runner. Steve and Dion rescued a board rider metres from the rock wall, before being smashed by 3 rogue waves flipping the craft backwards, while Dion was swept overboard ending up on the beach north of Kirra. Steve was stunned, semi-conscious as he was hit on the head by the surfboard but still managed to rescue the board rider. PC Geoff Hamlet said they definitely risked their lives to effect the surf rescues, they entered the water without hesitation. Dion and Steve were taken to the hospital for a check-up as they swallowed plenty of water and were discharged later in the night.

The beach was closed for the remainder of the day due to the dangerous surf conditions.

Our second BM course finally ran in March after being cancelled earlier in the year. 7 new Bronzies joined the Cooly crew with all completing at least one patrol before the season end.

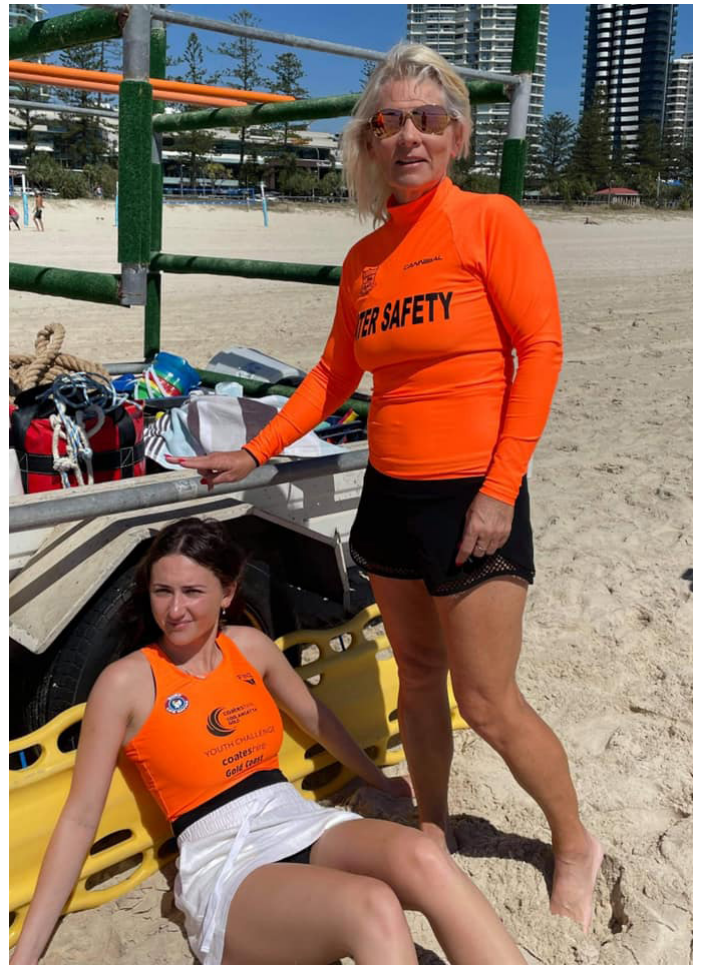

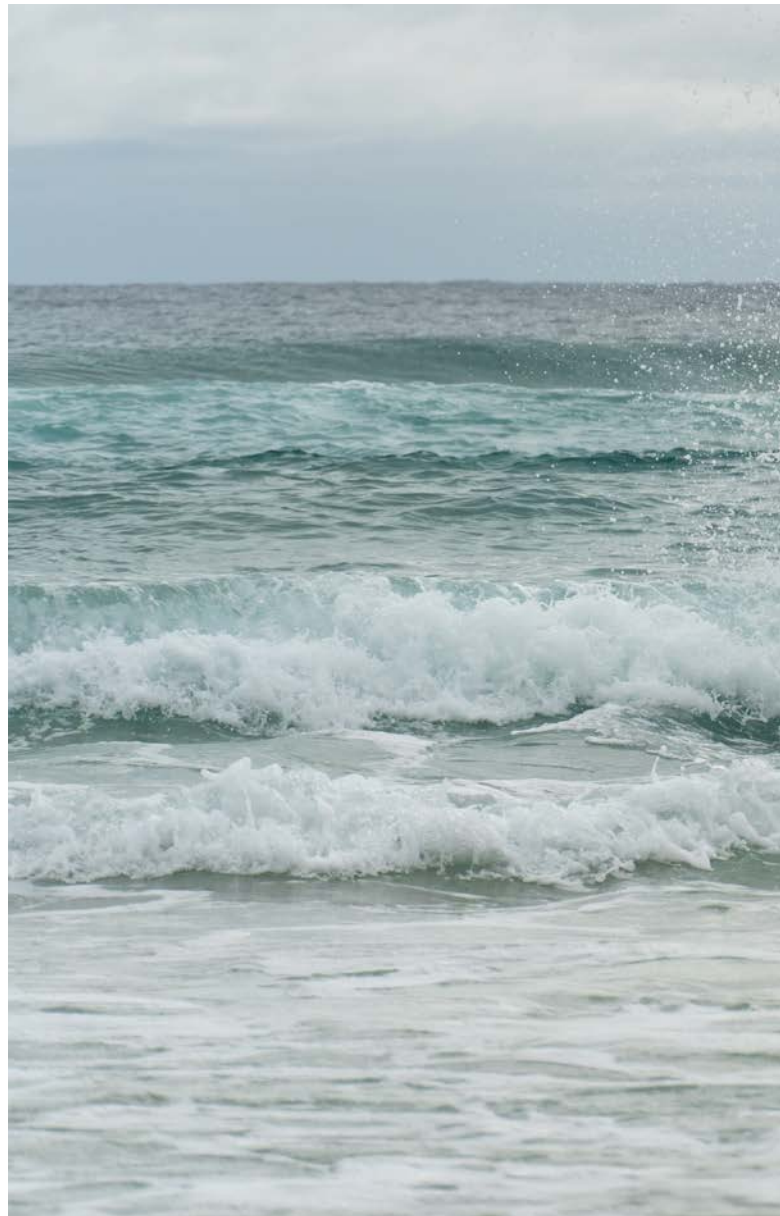

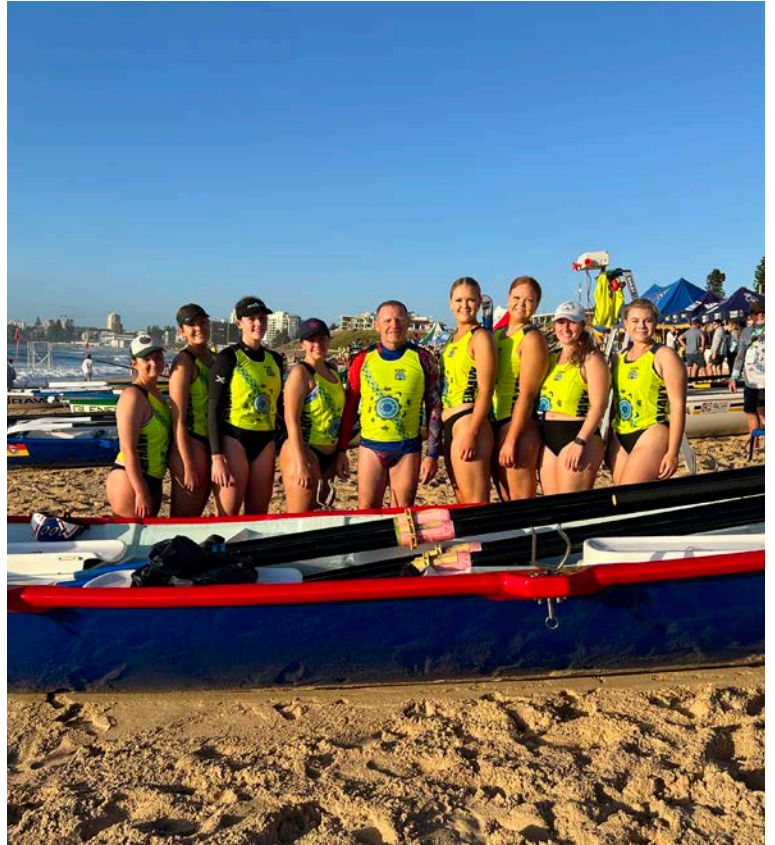






SURF BOATS

The principal activities of the Association during the financial year were to promote, advance and control the work of Surf Life Saving and encourage members to realise their potential and athletic abilities through education and participation in surf life saving competition.

Significant Changes

No significant changes in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

Operating Result

The surplus of the Association for the financial year amounted to \$577,722 (2021: \$243,622).

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 April 2022

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of Preparation

The Committee has prepared these financial statements on the basis that the Association is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. These financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations and the disclosure requirements of *AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements*, *AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows*, *AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors* and *AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures*.

Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is a not-for-profit entity for the purpose of preparing these financial statements. The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected assets and financial instruments for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

(b) New Accounting Standards Applicable During the Year

There were no new standards applicable during the year that have a material effect on these financial statements.

(c) Overall Considerations

The significant accounting policies that have been used in the preparation of these financial statements are summarised below. All policies were applicable in the prior year unless otherwise stated.

(d) Revenue

Revenue from Contracts with Customers

Revenue is recognised at an amount that reflects the consideration to which the Association is expected to be entitled in exchange for transferring goods or services to a customer. For each contract with a customer, the Association: identifies the contract with a customer; identifies the performance obligations in the contract; determines the transaction price which takes into account estimates of variable consideration and the time value of money; allocates the transaction price to the separate performance obligations on the basis of the relative stand-alone selling price of each distinct good or service to be delivered; and recognises revenue when or as each performance obligation is satisfied in a manner that depicts the transfer to the customer of the goods or services promised.

Grant Revenue

Grant revenue is recognised when the rights to the grant have been established, and the amount can be reliably measured.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised when it becomes receivable on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rate applicable to the financial asset, over the agreed period of time.

All revenue is stated net of goods and services tax.

(e) Operating Expenses

Operating expenses are recognised in the profit or loss upon utilisation of the service or at the date of their origin.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 April 2022

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

(g) Fair Value of Assets and Liabilities

The Association measures some of its assets and liabilities at fair value on either a recurring or non-recurring basis, depending on the requirements of the applicable accounting standard.

Fair value is the price the Association would receive to sell an asset or would have to pay to transfer a liability in an orderly (unforced) transaction between independent, knowledgeable, and willing market participants at the measurement date.

As fair value is a market based measure, the closest equivalent observable market pricing information is used to determine fair value. Adjustments to fair value may be made have regard to the characteristics of the specific asset or liability. The fair value of assets and liabilities that are not traded in an active market are determined using one or more valuation techniques. These valuation techniques maximise, to the extent possible, the use of observable market data.

(h) Impairment of Assets

Assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use.

(i) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

(j) Right of Use Assets and Lease Liability

The Association recognises a right-of-use asset and a lease liability at the lease commencement date, which is the date that the lessor makes the asset available for use by the Association.

Right-of-use asset

The right-of-use asset is initially measured at cost, which comprises:

- the amount of the initial measurement of the lease liability;
- any lease payments made at or before the commencement date, less any lease incentive received; and
- any initial direct costs incurred by the Group.

After the commencement date, the right-of-use asset is measured at cost less any accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. Right-of-use assets are depreciated using the straight-line depreciation method, from the commencement date to (a) the end of the useful life of the underlying asset, in case the lease transfers ownership of the underlying asset to the Group by the end of the lease term, or the lease contains a purchase option that the Group is reasonably certain to exercise, or (b) the earlier of the end of the useful life and the end of the lease term, in all other cases.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 April 2022

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

(j) Right of Use Assets and Lease Liability (Continued)

Lease liability

The lease liability is initially measured at the present value of the lease payments that are not paid at the commencement date, discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease or, if that rate cannot be readily determined, the respective Association's incremental borrowing rate. Lease payments included in the measurement of the lease liability comprise the following:

- fixed payments, less any lease incentives receivable;
- variable lease payments that depend on an index or a rate, initially measured using the index or rate as at the commencement date;
- amounts expected to be payable by the Group under residual value guarantees;
- the exercise price of a purchase option if the Group is reasonably certain to exercise that option; and
- payments of penalties for early terminating the lease, if the Group is reasonably certain to exercise an option to early terminate the lease.

After the commencement date, the lease liability is measured by:

increasing the carrying amount to reflect interest on the lease liability;
reducing the carrying amount to reflect the lease payments made; and
remeasuring the carrying amount to reflect any reassessment or lease modifications, or to reflect the impact from a revised index or rate.

(k) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(l) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits. Cash equivalents are short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value. Bank overdrafts are shown within short term borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

(m) Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivable amounts due from customers and other receivables represent the principal amounts due at balance date less, where applicable, any unearned income and provisions for doubtful accounts. A provision for impairment of trade and other receivables is made when there is objective evidence that the Association will not be able to collect the debts. Bad debts are written off when identified.

(n) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the principal amounts outstanding at balance date plus, where applicable, any accrued interest.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 30 April 2022

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

(o) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, unless the GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to the Australian Taxation Office, are presented as operating cash flow.

(p) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under the provisions of Section 50-10 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(q) Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The Committee evaluate estimates and judgements incorporated into the financial statements based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Association.

(r) Property Plant and Equipment

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis or diminishing value over the asset's useful life commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis to write off the net cost of each item of property, plant and equipment over their expected useful lives as follows:

Buildings	25 years
Motor Vehicles	4 years
Plant and equipment	3 years

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting date.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when there is no future economic benefit to the Association. Gains and losses between the carrying amount and the disposal proceeds are taken to profit or loss.

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and any impairment losses.

(s) Going Concern

This financial report has been prepared on the going concern basis, which contemplated continuity of normal business activities and the realisation of assets and the settlement of liabilities in the ordinary course of business.



Opinion

I have audited the accompanying financial statements, being special purpose financial statements, of Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc. (the Association), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2022, the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and the committee member's declaration.

In my opinion, the accompanying financial statements of the Association is in accordance with the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*, including:

- i) Giving a true and fair view of its financial position as at 30 April 2022 and of its performance for the financial year ended on that date in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements; and

Basis for Audit Opinion

Without modifying my opinion, I draw attention to Note 1 (a) to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements have been prepared to assist the Association to meet the requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012*. As a result, the financial statements may not be suitable for another purpose. My report is intended solely for the Association and should not be distributed to or used by parties other than the Association. My opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Emphasis of Matter – Economic Dependence

Without modifying my opinion, I draw attention to Note 15 to the financial statements, which describes an economic dependence on the Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Supporters Club Inc. A majority of the Associations income is derived from rent, cost reimbursement and donations from the Supporters Club. Any reduction or cessation of this income may affect the Associations ability to continue as a going concern.

Responsibilities of Management and The Board Members for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the *Associations Incorporation Act (SA) 1985* and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012* and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial statements that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters relating to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Association or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board Members are responsible for overseeing the Association's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibility for the Audit of the Financial Statements

My objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes my opinion. My conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of my auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Association to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure, and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

I communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that I identify during my audit.
